

WHITMINSTER PARISH PLAN DATA WHITMINSTER PARISH PLAN QUESTIONNAIRE RESULTS

SECTION 1 - ABOUT YOU

1. The questionnaire was completed by a total of 118 households, with responses from all age groups of residents. The children's questionnaire results are not in the scope for this review. The most significant age range, 25 % for the first person identified in each household was between 41 and 50 years of age.



2. When considering how long residents had lived in the village, this was a very even distribution as shown in the graph below. 30 % of all responses came equally from the three ranges of years.






3. When asking why households had moved to the village, the main responses are indicated below. This was a free text response and residents gave more than one answer to this question.

Other responses included: for the village school, born in the parish, marriage and retired to the parish.

If you consider love the country life and love village life, as the same reason, then these two reasons together would be the main factor that influenced households to move to the village.



4a. When asking if households intended to stay in Whitminster, this was very positive. 82 % of all responses indicated that they intended to stay in Whitminster.

4b. When asking why people may move, we grouped the responses into headings. 81 % of households did not answer this question. This is in line with the 82 % of households that stated they intended to stay in the Whitminster. Responses were very clear in their opinion that the village had changed and become very noisy with problems with teenagers and local youths and they suggested that there was a lack of parental guidance with these groups.
