

WHITMINSTER PARISH PLAN QUESTIONNAIRE RESULTS

SECTION 7 – CRIME, POLICING AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

When asked how satisfied they were with the level of policing in the village, 59% of households that responded stated that they were not satisfied. Only 73% of households responded to this question.




- Reasons identified included, the need for more visible policing, lack of patrols, lack of police presence, police slow to respond to anti-social behaviour, increased noise and vandalism in the village and cars speeding through the village.
- When asking what other policing they would like to see in the village, 67% of households that responded stated that they wanted a more viable sign of policing in the village with PC's walking around the village. A further 15% of households stating that they wanted to see PC's interacting/talking to children during evening patrols.

WHITMINSTER PARISH PLAN DATA

Enquiring if residents had been victims of crime in the last 12 months. 68% of households stated that they had not been a victim of crime. While only 8% of households stated that they had been a victim of crime in the last 12 months.




- From the 9 households that stated that they had been a victim of crime in the last 12 months, 7 households stated that they had reported the crime.
- Asking residents in the village if they had used any other emergency services, the most used additional emergency service was the Ambulance Service.

Asking if households were satisfied with the response, 77% of households did not respond to this question. From those households that did respond, 70% of households stated that they were satisfied with the response while only 11% of households stated that they were not satisfied and 19% of responses stated that they did not have an opinion.



When asking households why they were not satisfied, responses included that they didn't arrive quick enough, and that their didn't appear to be anyone to follow up when the investigating officer was on a rest day.
